Last Wednesday our school community gathered together to celebrate Ash Wednesday during our school Mass supported by a number of parents and families.



A SPECIAL REMINDER

All children will be required to arrive in their full <u>Summer School Uniform</u> <u>SUMMER DRESS</u> for the GIRLS with black school shoes/sandals. <u>BOYS</u> will need to wear their <u>RED SPORTS TOP</u> (not their Blue polo) <u>with black school shoes</u>.

NB: Fleecy jackets are not required. Runners, sports shorts or skorts - NOT PERMITTED.

BELL TIMES – DOORS OPEN AT 8.40am SCHOOL COMMENCES AT 8.55am

Of course families are always most welcome to enter into our classroom spaces with their children from 8.40am each morning where the children will have an opportunity to proudly explain their learning focus on display or discuss their work books or simply talk with their friends, teachers and parents.

ABSENCES and LATE ARRIVALS (After 8.55am)

In compliance with our Child Safety Policies, we follow Government Legislative requirements and Catholic Education Melbourne directives and therefore children who arrive after 9.00am will be marked on our electronic roll as absent. Parents will then be notified electronically alerting them that their child is absent and are required to provide an explanation to be formally recorded.

If your child is absent, please inform the school office in writing, emails, in person or through our school's Flexi-buzz App. **For late arrivals after 8.55am**, a parent or carer must accompany the child to the school office, sign them in and collect a late pass.

Meet Joanne - The CommBank Rep this Friday @ 8.30am

Student banking is on Friday mornings. This important service is operated by volunteer parents from our SPARKLE Parents' Team. If your child is new to school banking or a child who wishes to open an account, they'll need a CommBank Youthsaver account. To open a Youthsaver account for your child please see the school office.

ROAD SAFETY ALERT – PARENTAL DUTY OF CARE

As a child safety issue, parents are reminded that after school, the children should wait at the front school gate under staff supervision until they are collected by their parent/guardian. Children, especially younger ones who wait for their parents at a pre-determined place or around the corner out of eyesight are unsupervised and may be placed in an unsafe situation.

Children who are not collected by 3.45pm are taken to the school office and remain there until their parents arrive.

STAFF ONLY CARPARK - DISABLED PARKING EXEMPTED.

Please be aware that there are two designated car parks for **disabled parking** within our Staff car park **for drivers displaying the current disabled passes when collecting their children.**

However, due to our lack of car parking spaces for our staff, families are not permitted to park in the staff car park. It remains a safety issue for children who are walking through our staff car park unsupervised before and after school.

ON THE SPOT FINES FOR TRAFFIC INFRINGEMENTS

Local Traffic By-laws officers will continue to monitor the traffic flow and parking around the school entrance and will issue on the spot fines for vehicles illegally parked.

We have also been informed that the **traffic officers** will be making random visits and issuing **on** the spot fines for vehicles illegally parked on nature strips, across driveways, driving over footpaths and breaking the road rules outside our school boundaries such as parents jaywalking especially as there are employed traffic supervisors keeping our pedestrians safe.

Please continue to be exemplary role models for our children by only crossing at the designated supervised school crossing and obeying the whistle. Please take care for the safety of all, not just your child.
