Dear Parents and Families,

Please take a well-deserved bow and our thanks for the integral role you played in supporting your children's learning designed by our teachers and staff and building on our Family - School partnership.

As we conclude our sixth and just as fulfilling year as a contemporary Catholic primary school within our vibrant parish of Christ the Light, I'd like to acknowledge all who have contributed to growing our rich school story throughout 2020.

Continuing on from our previous years, the 2020 school year commenced with much hope and promise only to be interrupted by the global pandemic. Despite COVID and in a true sense of Family - School partnership, we supported our children and joined together to provide our children and community with a number of memorable and innovative learning experiences and countless opportunities to grow and shine during remote learning and onsite learning.

A year of ...

I can re-assure families that your children transitioned smoothly back into on site learning and are a testament to you and to our unique learning culture by demonstrating their resilience and focus throughout this term in particular. Unfortunately parents and families missed out on witnessing their young learners' remarkable and inspirational journey by being prevented from entering their learning areas throughout 2020 which left parents wondering.

I can only wonder what might have been if we had experienced a COVID free school year.

2020 in particular has also been dominated in the social media by "Trumpism" where if you say something long enough and loud enough and present it as fact, it must be true, despite evidence to the contrary.

This was reflected in a recent report which states that over half of the Australians surveyed are concerned about the impact of "Fake News" and "disinformation". Unfortunately some at SPA Doreen have been the unlucky recipients of some of this misinformation and have been puzzled by the mixed messages.

Why Some Families Are Leaving

COVID took the world by surprise and challenged our sense of security and even self-worth, forcing people to re-evaluate their lives and SPA Doreen was caught up in the uncertainty like the rest of the world.

- 1. As parents in our school community may be aware, families have left our SPA community during COVID, especially during lockdown or will commence at other schools in 2021. During that time it's important to note that we have enrolled twenty new students throughout the 2020 school year.
- 2. However we will <u>commence with our three Prep classes once again in 2021</u> which reinforces the fact that we are still bottom heavy with the majority of our children learning happily in Years Prep to Four in 2021.
- 3. On speaking with a number of my colleagues who are principals of Catholic Schools in our North Central and North Eastern Zones, this appears to be a <u>similar pattern in their Catholic schools</u> where they have lost a number of families during COVID only to enroll others throughout the year.
- 4. At the start of COVID, the way businesses worked were forced to change and a number of parents were forced to work remotely from home for the remainder of the year, removing the convenience of dropping off or picking up their children on their way to and from work. It was inevitable, practical and understandable, that these families would decide to enroll at their local school with a number living in and around our sister school in St Mary's Whittlesea,
- 5. Five families seized the opportunity to sell their homes with a 28 day settlement period before the lock-down which enabled them to relocate to COVID-free Queensland during second term.
- 6. Other families sold up or will relocate closer to their families, or for life-style, for health, for upsizing or to take-up new work opportunities, in places such as <u>Kilmore, Whittlesea, Plenty, Bundoora, Greensborough, Mill Park, Epping, Mt Waverly, Lakes Entrance, Finley NSW and a for family trip around Australia. Have you noticed the number of houses on the market in this area?</u>
- 7. Unfortunately in these uncertain COVID times, some families have also experienced <u>family upheaval and crisis</u>, loss and <u>grief or serious health issues</u> requiring them to move homes and we send our best wishes to them.
- 8. Like many in our society, others were <u>impacted by financial hardships with the loss of income or security</u> and families have had to make a decision as to whether they could still afford a Catholic education when battling to keep afloat in this crisis within this heavy mortgage belt area.
- 9. Others, many of whom were <u>foundation families or have their children in the Middle Year Level</u> <u>remain frustrated with the slow rate of progress of the development of our facilities</u> (impacted by COVID) for their children and have decided to move to much larger better resourced schools. Unfortunately Catholic schools are subjected to a different capital funding model and can apply only once each stage has been completed. We cannot compete with new Government State schools who receive a total funding package to complete their new school in their first year.
- 10. Parents have also needed to make the tough decision based <u>on their child's educational, friendship circle or social needs which I respect.</u>

I remain confident that their children will cope in their initial transition into a different way of teaching and learning in a much larger school setting as they continue their learning journey.

I thank these families for their support throughout the years and wish them every success for their child's educational journey in the years ahead.

Stage Two A Capital Funding Confirmation

Following on from Danielle Green's recent media announcement of our success in securing a Smarty grant I am now permitted to state that we have received correspondence confirming our Victorian Government Capital Funding capital works project to commence in 2021.

This funding will enable us to commence the construction of a multi-purpose STEAM presentation facility, a new Senior Level Learning space incorporating classrooms and extension to our Admin spaces.

"I refer to the letter from the Hon James Merlino, Deputy Premier and Minister for Education, sent via email in October 2020, approving funding assistance to enable your school to undertake the following capital project" **Megan Ioannou Company Secretary Catholic Capital Grants (Vic) LTD.**

To keep within the ambience and flow of our uniquely designed learning spaces, we have once again engaged the services of Owen West principal architect from **Hayball Architects** who have designed our previous two stages.

After a lengthy delay, works have been proceeding over the past three weeks, ensuring that the **Synthetic** basketball/netball courts with a dual running track will be ready for our children to use on day one of Term One 2021

Marymede Doreen Campus Update

Preliminary works should commence for the **Marymede Doreen campus**, which is still planned to open in 2024 (once formal agreement and funding have been acquired) as well as planning for the **Marymede Pre-school campus**. Throughout 2020 I have been working closely with Michael Kenny (Principal) and his team from Marymede College, CEM, the Archdiocese of Melbourne and Y2 Architecture on many occasions as they continue to develop their Masterplan and incorporated aspects of our Masterplan for the provision of shared sports and recreation facilities.

Semester Two Reports

The content of our December Report is based on the observations, records and assessment data collated by our teachers throughout the semester. However, throughout this second semester, remote learning impacted on the lives of our young learners and their families. While a number of children showed great resilience and engagement, others found it difficult to engage in the learning on a regular basis or to submit their learning tasks.

Three months on, these learning samples were used alongside other data gathered by the teachers to assist teachers in their judgement when reporting a child's progress and growth throughout Terms Three and Four. Some areas were not reported on and other children were noted as "Building" as there was not enough evidence available at the time to support their growth. Therefore, this does not necessarily mean that the child may have slipped in a particular key learning area this Semester however next year's teacher will carefully monitor each child closely as they transition into their new classes.

We thank the teachers for their diligence and commitment to knowing and developing each individual child in their care.

Class Lists & Orientation Session

A great deal of time, consideration and collaboration is given to the creation of a new class list, which is carefully balanced and fine-tuned to ensure that the children (with their own input) are matched not only with a friend or a learning buddy but also with a particular teacher/LSO as required.

Yesterday's 2021 Orientation Session enabled the children (including a number of new children to our school) to spend time getting to know their new classmates, teachers and Year Level to alleviate any unnecessary anxiety over the school holidays. Once again I commend the teachers and leaders on their astute professional judgement in grouping the children.

Four 2021 Prep Orientation Sessions – So Rewarding

Earlier this term and coinciding with the easing of COVID Restrictions allowing up to 10 people to enter our school site, we arranged three Orientation Sessions in groups of up to five pre-schoolers while their parents learnt more about school life in a separate room. The children relished the opportunity to visit their school.

As COVID restrictions eased further, we allowed up to ten pre-schooler per session and then introduced a fourth Prep Orientation Session allowing the children and their teachers to gather in their 2021 Prep classes. We look forward to welcoming these enthusiastic children and their families (including a number of current SPA families) into our school community.

Farewell to our Year Six Graduates





After living through a COVID interrupted school year and five months of remote schooling, our Year Six children relished the opportunity to celebrate their time at SPA Doreen last Thursday night, supported by their families, staff, Fr Martin and Fr Shymon and some of their Year Five classmates.

Our impressive young graduates reflected on their rich educational journey here at SPA providing us with their insights gained, their thoughts about leadership and also shared their recollections and hopes and dreams with those lucky enough to be present during a special prayer liturgy.

I congratulate our aspiring young leaders, thank them for helping to enrich our learning culture and wish them much success and fulfilment in the years ahead.

Well done to our Inaugural School Captains

Building on the outstanding leaders and role models throughout the previous five years, we decided to formalise the student leadership structures this year with the election of four school captains from Year Six as voted by their Year Five and Six peers with input from the staff.

Despite the limitations of lockdown, these school captains **Zara Capp, Isabelle Becker, Jacob Funston and Billy James** (who relocated to Queensland during COVID) were outstanding and articulate role models and remained very visible throughout the year. I congratulate and thank them for their passion and inclusivity and acknowledge the enormous efforts of our other school leaders and their teams throughout 2020.

As mentioned, Billy James who was enrolled as a Year One child when our doors opened in February 2015, left us five and a half years later as an inspirational young leader and deep thinker.

While we take great pride in Billy's achievement, it's equally pleasing that the feedback we continue to receive from the secondary colleges is that children enrolled from SPA Doreen stand out as confident engaged learners. Our children are recognised for their lateral thinking, high level communication and social skills, their ability to problem solve and to think outside the square and their willingness to collaborate with their peers and staff. This future proofs them as they live in this ever changing world.

Our children and staff continue to be highly regarded by key leaders within the CEM, which was highlighted when we were selected to broadcast on Live FM hosted by Ralph Barber to celebrate Catholic Education. Our children also featured in the CEM STEM MAD (Making A Difference) Showcase.

As life-long learners, our staff continued to be invited into a variety of committees or Research projects including our continuing membership in LEAC (Languages Education Action Committee) and a personal invitation to participate in Harvard Graduate School of Education Project Zero Summer School and the Learner Agency PL modules and also accepted into Mathematics in the Future PL modules facilitated through the Ed Partnerships Team.
